
These days, kids spend much more time inside, mostly thanks to technology. Spending time outdoors isn't just enjoyable - it's also necessary. Many researchers agree that kids who play outside are happier, better at paying attention and less anxious than kids who spend more time indoors. Spending time in nature can build their confidence. There's a lot less structure than most types of indoor play and they can choose how they interact with the nature around them. This gives them practice managing their own actions and encourages creativity and imagination. Being outdoors can also teach them responsibility. For example, if they are in charge of watering a plant, they can learn that they must take care of living things to keep them alive. Being outside gets kids moving, too. Regardless of what they're doing, there's usually more exercise involved than if they were sitting on the couch. Not only is exercise good for kids' bodies, but it seems to make them more focused. This is especially helpful for kids with ADHD. Being outside also helps kids feel less stressed.

Early Childhood Fun Fact: Cases of heat stroke spike during the summer months, and this can be life-threatening in children. Prior to heat stroke, kids often show milder symptoms such as heat cramps and heat exhaustion. Make sure children take water breaks and wear lightweight clothing when playing outside.

Sanctuary Video Projection System

In order to continue to provide adequate video services for worship services, funerals, weddings, etc., upgrades are needed. This technology is also used to livestream our services for online viewers.

Video equipment has been experiencing failures as of late and it is leading to issues for the church audio/visual techs as well as visually.

The old system is from 2011 (pre-High Definition). A new widescreen system is being requested.

Presentation Video System Upgrade: \$19,485.31 Sanctuary Streaming Camera System: \$17,980.92 Both of these upgrades are intended to go hand in hand.

The Leadership Board is requesting donations to help fund the 2nd part of the project. Endowment Fund interest will be used as well.
