Greetings!

It's August! Hard to believe that it is back-to-school season. The stores have been stocking up on school supplies since school was out, but now the sales are on! I have a cousin who is in charge of an elementary school cafeteria in South Carolina, and they were back in school in July! Time flies when you're having fun?!?!

I have to admit that when the advertisements for the back-to-school sales start, I get a bit nostalgic. Going back to school when I was in elementary, middle, and high school meant I got to see my friends five days a week, which was, of course, more important than what I was learning. When I started college, back-to - school meant I was closer to my degree and making money. When it was time to go back to seminary, I looked forward to seeing my friends, of course, but the expectation that I would learn something profound overtook. Oh, I still complained about writing three papers every night, but what I was learning was incredible! The way I experienced the change of my relationship with the Holy was at times mind-blowing, and I grew deeper and deeper in love with God.

One of the requirements to graduate from a United Methodist seminary is history, doctrine, and polity of The United Methodist Church. My very first Methodism class was history and doctrine, and I experienced Jesus Christ in so many ways as I studied the history of John and Charles Wesley and how Methodism was born, and how the Wesley's developed a theology that still guides me today. I did take the required polity class, and then I took every other class on Wesleyan theology and Methodist history that was offered as my electives.

Deuteronomy instructs the Hebrew people, "Hear, O Israel: The Lord is our God, the Lord alone. You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your might. Keep these words that I am commanding you today in your heart. Recite them to your children and talk about them when you are at home and when you are away, when you lie down and when you rise. Bind them as a sign on your hand, fix them as an emblem on your forehead, and write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates" (Deuteronomy 6:4-9)

Jewish people have done that over the ages. They have the "Shema" which are the words of verses four and five. They are to teach these words to their children every day. So they have Mezuzahs that contain these words on the doors of their homes and touch it when they leave and when they return, reminding them to teach them. When they pray, you will see leather boxes on their foreheads or around their arms, which contain the words from Deuteronomy. Jewish parents have continued to teach their children these words.

We have confirmation, where young people are taught about the Christian faith and maybe about The United Methodist Church, but what about adults? Before becoming a member, one needs to go through a "New Member" class. I can say in my new member class, I learned about the polity of the church, and John and Charles Wesley started the movement, but I didn't hear a lot about the doctrine of the church. I often wonder what we might become if we learn and share what United Methodists in the Wesleyan tradition think and believe?

As I was praying about what I would preach in August, Wesleyan thoughts kept coming to my mind. Well, I have preached some of Wesley's sermons before and there are a lot more that can...and probably should be preached. But there didn't seem to be a confirmation from God on that. Then the thought of the Wesleyan Quadrilateral came to mind. God seemed to continue to affirm that thought. So for the month of August, I will be preaching the Quadrilateral, don't know what that is? Join us on Sunday mornings at 10:00 in August and find out. We don't have to wear these words in a leather box on our foreheads, or touch a container on our doors whenever we leave or come home, but wouldn't it be wonderful if we can share some of what makes Methodism what it is? As a very intelligent person once told me, you are never too old to learn something new, something valuable, something life-changing.

Hope to see you in church!



With that in mind, I announced to the congregation that Rev. Dr. Mona Joslyn is being appointed to our congregation for another year, and hopefully two.

Pastor Mona has brought so much stability, care, love, and pastoral leadership to our congregation! We are truly blessed to have her continue to be our shepherd.

Pastor Mona will be appointed only to Owosso First and no longer be serving Owosso Trinity as she has in the past. With this comes additional responsibility and opportunity as a congregation to surround her with our love and support for her compensation package.

We have the opportunity to come alongside Pastor Mona and really blossom as a congregation in sustaining her compensation, insurance, and pension package. The total for July through December 2024 is \$45,562.50. (Previously, First UMC was funding 75% and Trinity UMC was funding 25%). Our mission is to get as close to \$7,593.75 a month for the remaining five months.

I truly believe that this time Pastor Mona is being appointed to Owosso First has been ordained by God. Just as all of us together who continue to support, volunteer and sustain God's church have been placed together for this time. God is using this time for all of us to respond and bring His church even closer to His people and grow it all to His Glory! Romans 13:1 "Let every soul be subject unto the higher powers. For there is no power but of God: the powers that are ordained of God."

Joshua 24:15 "But as for me and my household, we will serve the Lord." As the Chair of the Leadership Board, I can tell you now that I will be supporting Pastor Mona and coming alongside her in this mission as we continue to build up God's Kingdom here at Owosso First United Methodist Church! I invite you all as well to come alongside her ministry.

May the peace and grace of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ Bless you and your family as you prayerfully consider how you might respond to this challenge.


YARNSPIRATIONS ~ Sunday, August 11 at 3pm
