And those who ate were about five thousand men, besides women and children" (Matthew 14:14-21 NRSV).

God can take something very small and when we are thankful, when we offer thanksgiving to the Giver, our cups overflow! You don't have to have "it all" as a church or as a family, thankfulness brings abundance!


